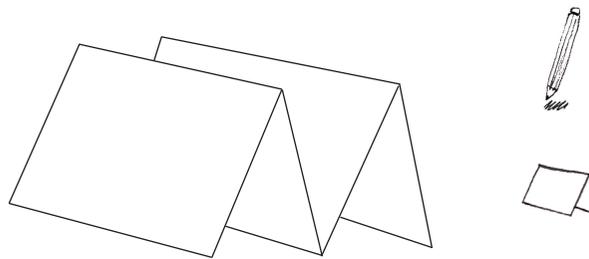

**Step 1:** Each player has a template page. Fold the sheet in half then fold out again along the other two dotted lines. The paper should look like below!

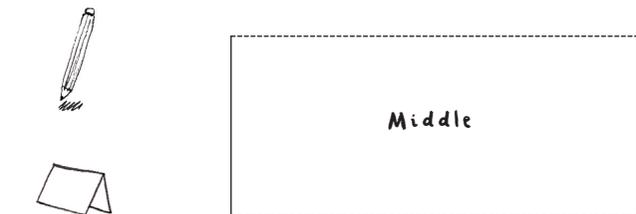
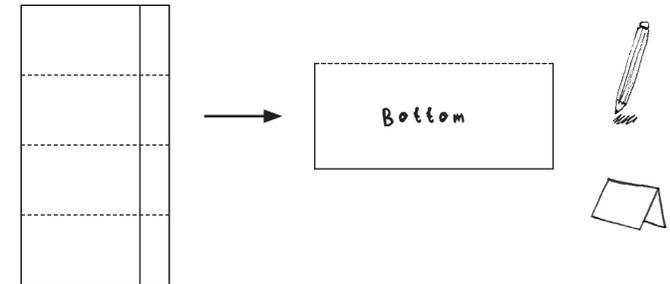


**Step 3:** Pass the sheet to the left, so that everyone has a new sheet. Continue drawing your skyscraper design on the middle layer. Once finished turn the page over to hide the drawing, then pass to your left!

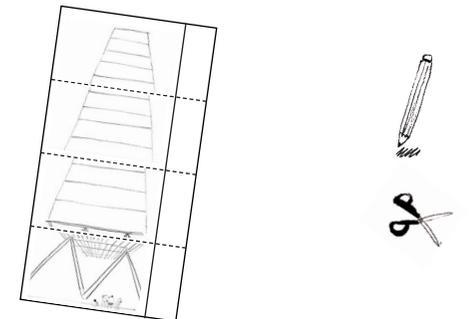
**Step 4:** Continue these steps until you get to the roof to finish your foldout skyscraper!



**Step 2:** Each player starts by drawing the bottom of a skyscraper. Once finished, fold the sheet over to the middle layer and hide the first drawing!



**Step 5:** Fold out the paper and look at the skyscraper you have all created! If you want, you can colour it in and cut it out too.

#### MIDDLE

#### BOTTOM

Visible from the street often with big entrance area  
What does the bottom of your skyscraper look like!? Think about doors, stairs and shapes...
